Intro music

The tradition of Christmas comes directly from man-made winter solstice pagan practices. This goes all the way back to Biblical times.

Have we considered that Christmas tradition around the world has directly come from paganism and that we are just following traditions of men and not the Bible?

Introduction to the History of Christianity, edited by Tim Dowley, says on page 141, "The Christian church took over many pagan ideas and images. From sun-worship, for example, came the celebration of Christ's birth on the twenty—fifth of December, the birthday of the Sun. Saturnalia, the Roman winter festival of 17-21 of December, provided the merriment, gift giving and candles typical of later Christmas holidays."

What does the Creator of the Universe say to us through the Bible? Jeremiah 10:2-4 Thus says Yahweh, "Do not learn the way of the nations, and do not be terrified by the signs of the heavens although the nations are terrified by them; for the customs of the peoples are a delusion; because it is wood cut from the forest, the work of the hands of a craftsman with a cutting tool. They decorate it with silver and with gold; they fasten it with nails and with hammers So that it will not totter."

Early on in American history the Puritans rejected the Church of England's celebration of Christmas due to it's history and what the Bible says and does not say about it.

For example, Yahweh specifically forbids adopting pagan worship directed to Him, Deuteronomy 12:30-31 "...you do not inquire after their gods, saying, 'How do these nations serve their gods, that I also may do likewise?' "You shall not behave thus toward Yahweh your Elohim, for every abominable act which Yahweh hates they have done for their gods..."

One final thought, is that we are specifically told in Scripture to remember the Savior's death though the Appointed time of Passover, as He is our Passover Lamb and Savior. For more information read the booklet, *Passover A Memorial for All Time*
