Tongues of Fire

Now that Passover and the Feast of Unleavened Bread are over, we move on to Pentecost on June 8th. For our new subscribers, Pentecost is Greek for “count 50.” In the Hebrew, it is Shavuot. There are 7 full weeks between the wave sheaf offering and Pentecost. It is widely believed that Pentecost in the New Testament is the birth of the Assembly. Yahweh’s Spirit was given to remain on earth to help us in our walk with Yahshua to keep the law.



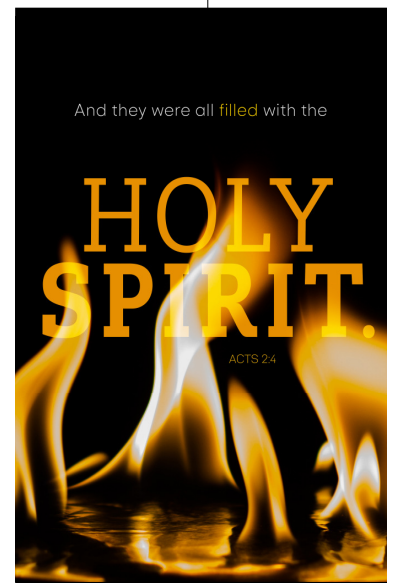
The early disciples in Acts were obediently keeping this special day. It was on this very day of Pentecost in Acts 2 that the Holy Spirit was sent to remain permanently. Prior to that, the Holy Spirit was only given to certain individuals to

perform a specific purpose. (Read Acts 2:1.) In John 6:7, Yahshua had promised to send the Comforter (Holy Spirit). He told the disciples not to depart from Jerusalem but to await the promise of the Father that in a few days, they would be baptized by the Holy Spirit. The disciples were gathered together keeping Pentecost and appearing as tongues of fire, the gift of the Holy Spirit was poured upon them and they were able to speak other languages. Speaking in tongues, however, does not mean unintelligible gibberish. (Request our booklet, “Deciphering the Gift of Tongues” for more in depth study.)

In the Old Testament, two leavened loaves of bread were offered before Yahweh. We read in John 20:15-17, Yahshua became the Old Testament symbol of the wave sheaf offering by presenting Himself to Yahweh as the Wave Sheaf, thus fulfilling Leviticus 23:10-11. By understanding the wheat and tares parable of Matthew 13, we are given a deeper insight into Yahshua’s role as the Wave Sheaf. Have a very blessed Shavuot!

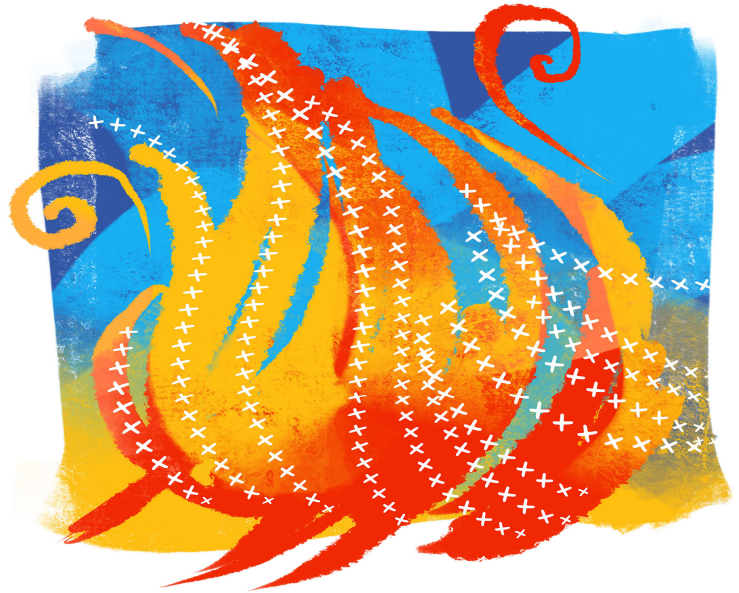
