Prepare for the Fall Holy Days

Summer is quickly winding down, and Yahweh's people are preparing for His fall Holy Days. In this issue, we'll look at the first two Holy Days of fall: The Feast of Trumpets and the Day of Atonement. Both are very important to Yahweh's plan of salvation, as are all the Holy Days. There are a total of four fall Holy Days, and seven total yearly Holy Days.



Feast of Trumpets is known as *Yom Teruah* in Hebrew. The word implies "blowing" as in blowing a trumpet or shofar. It is a joyful convocation of Yahweh's people and should be treated like a Sabbath, in that no work should be done. The blowing of shofars were used extensively in ancient Israel. They could be a call to


gather, or even a call to battle, depending on what tone was used. Many Bible prophecy scholars believe it's possible that Yahshua could return on the Feast of Trumpets, but no one knows for sure.

The Day of Atonement is known as *Yom Kippur* in Hebrew, and it is implied to be a day of "covering." It is a day of fasting, as we are to afflict our souls. No food and liquids are to be consumed for twenty-four hours. This is the only commanded fast. Fasting is generally a way that people humble themselves. In history, whenever a country faced grave circumstances, a national fast was sometimes declared, including in ancient Israel. A fast shows Yahweh that His people are willing to humble themselves and obey Him.

Atonement brings to mind the fleeting nature of life and our dependence upon food and water. In Yahweh, we find immortality. Praise Yahweh for His meaningful Holy Days. We learn about His plan of salvation through them as we keep them every year. May all our readers be blessed this fall Holy Day season.


