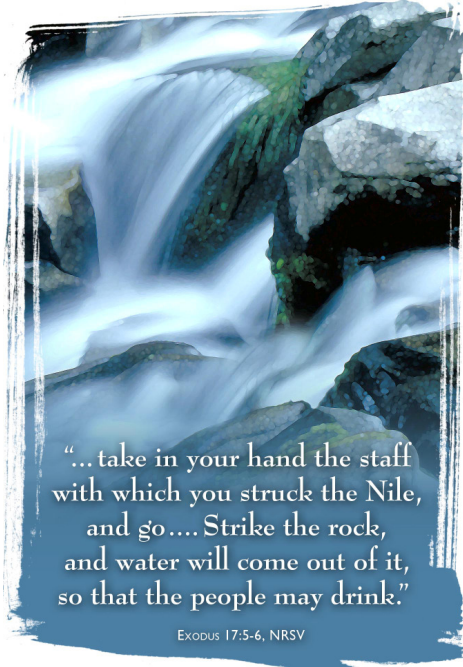


KIDS FOR YAH

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MOSES AND THE EXODUS



When the Israelites were slaves in Egypt, Pharaoh was concerned that the Hebrew population was multiplying too quickly, so he decreed that baby boys were not allowed to live when they were born, thus his hope was to reduce the Hebrew population. But Moses’s mother hid him in a basket and sent him floating down the Nile river to save his life. Moses had a brother named Aaron and a sister named Miriam.

Pharaoh’s daughter found him, and raised him as her own son. Moses was raised in the best schools in Egypt. When he grew up, he found out that he was actually a Hebrew. He killed one of the Egyptian taskmasters who was beating a Hebrew slave. Because of this, he fled into the wilderness and eventually

He can work with a humble and contrite heart.

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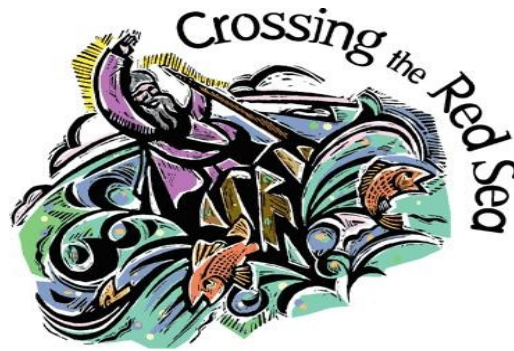

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WAY, PATH

The Hebrew word for “Way” or “Path” is “Derek.” It sounds like “Deh-rehk.”



In Ancient Hebrew the letter “D” looks like: (a tent door - a flap hanging downward at the tent’s opening, allowing movement in and out). It stands for the words: Door, Move, Hang, Enter.



The next Ancient Hebrew letter “R” looks like: (a person’s head). It stands for the words: Person, First, Top, Beginning.



The last Ancient Hebrew letter “K” looks like: (an open hand sweeping or clearing things aside, allowing work to be done.) It stands for the words: Open, Bend, Tame.

To make the word “way” or “path,” the three letters are written together like this:



In Hebrew, words are read from right to left – just the opposite of English words.



So, what is made when a person leaves the door of the house to go a certain place, and then returns, many times? A WAY or PATH! (If we walk there enough times, it becomes a way or path of life. A certain part of a field becomes tame or smooth under our feet – the obstacles, such as sticks and stones are removed.)

Almost all Hebrew words are made with letters that are arranged so as to define or explain each word!
