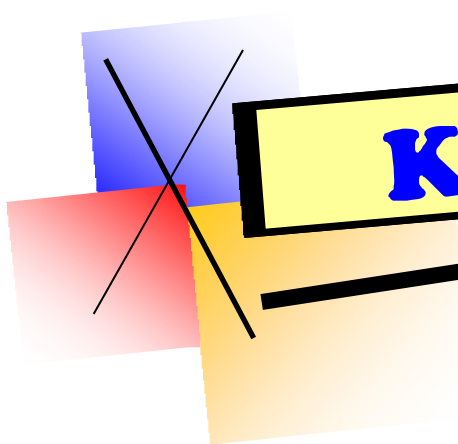




KIDS FOR YAH

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Yahshua heals a Soldier's servant

Yahshua was in Capernaum when a commander of the Roman army approached him and respectfully told Him about his servant who was ill. Yahshua said that He would go to the commander's home. The Roman officer shook his head and said (paraphrased), "That is not necessary, Master. It is not right according to your law, that You enter the house of a Gentile. I understand your ability and power to heal. I rule under many soldiers. When I give an order, it is done. All I need You to do, Master, is give the command and my servant will be healed."

Yahshua was amazed at this man's words. He declared, "Truly, I have not found faith like this among my own people! Go home. Your servant has been healed." The Roman soldier demonstrated a strong faith that we all should have. You may notice that the Roman soldier recognized that there was a separation at the time between Yahweh's people and the gentiles. What is a gentile? In Scripture we see that people were divided into two groups: The Jews (Hebrews) and the gentiles. In the Old Testament, Yahweh revealed Himself to the Hebrews. Everyone else who did not follow Yahweh became known as gentiles, including some of Yahweh's people who became known as the "lost sheep of the House of Israel." But Yahshua taught that Yahweh has a deep concern for all of mankind, whether they be Hebrew or not. Yahweh is love, and we are even reminded in Scripture that He does not take pleasure in the destruction of the wicked. All of mankind has an equal opportunity for salvation. In fact, the wall of separation between Jews and gentiles was torn down. All of mankind who will accept Yahshua's sacrifice will be in Yahweh's glorious, future Kingdom.

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TRUST

(Faith, Believe)

The Hebrew word for “Trust (Faith, Believe)” is “Emoona.” It sounds like: “Eh-mu-nah’.” Of the three English words used for this Hebrew word, “Trust” is the strongest action word.



In Ancient Hebrew the letter “A” looks like: (a head of an ox). It stands for the words: Strength, Power, Chief.



The next Ancient Hebrew letter “M” looks like: (waves of moving water). It stands for the words: Chaos, Mighty, Blood.



The third Ancient Hebrew letter “U” looks like: (a tent peg). It stands for the words: Add, Secure, Hook, Connect.

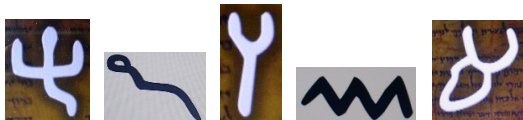


The fourth Ancient Hebrew letter “N” looks like: (a seed sprouting). It stands for the words: Continue, Heir, Son, Life.



The last Ancient Hebrew letter “H” looks like: (a man with arms raised up). It stands for the words: Look, Reveal, Breath.

To make the word “Trust,” the five letters are written together like this:



. In Hebrew, words are read from right to left just the opposite of English words.

So, when a person is strongly moved and connected to the Life-giver and his actions show it, then he trusts in Yahweh. Others recognize his trust (faith, belief) because of his confidence in Yahweh. When you know Yahweh’s faithfulness, then trusting is easy!
